Marjorie Neusch Massey Scholarship	Range from \$100- \$1,000	Selected by competition, King's student recipients are awarded small grants to help defray the costs associated with studying abroad for one semester (minimum of 12 credits) or a summer term (minimum of 6 credits). The purpose of this grant is to support students who wish to study abroad in order to challenge and expand their understanding of the world and global relations. Students must demonstrate financial need And be accepted into an approved program. Hints & Tips for Finding and Applying to Scholarships

- **DO NOT WAIT UNTIL YOU HAVE BEEN ACCEPTED INTO A STUDY ABROAD PROGRAM TO START APPLYING FOR SCHOLARSHIPS.**
- **MANY APPLICATIONS ARE DUE OVER ONE YEAR IN ADVANCE OF STUDYING ABROAD**—before you even apply for your study abroad program—START EARLY!!!
- Make good use of your academic writing skills. Revise all essays and ask for feedback on your work. If possible, schedule an appointment with the [Writing Center](#) in the ground floor of the Mulligan Building.
- Are you a good writer? Or perhaps a talented photographer? Look for student travel writing and photography contests for extra funding ideas. For instance the Transitions Abroad writing contest:

- Ask your parents if any scholarships exist at their workplace for children of employees.
- Look in your community— funding may be available through civic, ethnic, or religious groups. For example, former **Girl Scouts** should look at <http://www.cjsfoundation.org/>.
- Are you a member of **any honor societies**? If so, check to see whether study abroad scholarships are offered to members of your society.
