PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

CITYSERVE | MONARCH COURT

HCE groups go on an interactive walking tour to learn about volunteer opportunities and nonprofits in the neighborhood surrounding King's. Any students with mobility issues can contact their HCE co-leader for assistance or other ways to participate.

A documentary born from tragedy but inspired a national safety campaign. This film opens an honest dialogue and educates young adults to ensure preventable situations like this never happen again.


