“God is simply too important to us not to talk about.” Theology means talking about God. It dares to speak about what is ultimately significant about existence, explores the mystery of God, and proposes the meaning of the Christian wisdom about God for a good and happy life.

At King’s, one can study theology as a major, or to complement one’s primary major or profession as a second major or minor. With individualized attention from a dedicated theology faculty, our students ask their own questions about reality and God, encounter the great thinkers and wisdom traditions of Christian history, and practice theology’s unique methods of reasoned faith. Students will discover the powerful meaning and moral implication of ancient doctrinal debates for our modern context and as related to one’s own vocational, relational, and professional lives.

OPPORTUNITIES AT KING’S COLLEGE

Theological topics and methods often intersect with those of other disciplines, especially philosophy and history, but also literature, professional writing, political science, or sociology. Our programs are flexible and interdisciplinary, allowing students to pair a theology major or minor with other fields of study. Here's what makes our theology program unique:

Flexible and individualized: with small classes, close mentorship, and a welcoming community, students in the theology program also choose elective courses, and many pursue an independent study.

Transformative community: we introduce the Catholic tradition and live out its deep commitment to ecumenical and interfaith dialogue. Some graduates have found religious vocations beyond graduation.

Pathways to success: our program enhances critical thinking, deepens your understanding of human history and hope, and strengthens your oral and written communication skills.
