\*Placement to be determined. Only Spanish courses numbered 114 or above may be taken for major credit. If a student's background is not sufficient to begin the major with SPAN 114, all courses taken below 114 will be counted as electives.

\*\* Native and/or heritage speakers of Spanish should consult with the Department Chair, as they may be exempt from SPAN 233. In this case, the student must take an additional SPAN Major course of his/her/their choosing to meet the 24-credit requirement.

\*\*\* In addition to SPAN 114/SPAN 115, SPAN 231, SPAN 233, and SPAN 480, all students majoring in Spanish are required to take a Spanish literature course, a course with a focus on Latin America, and a course with a focus on Spain. See the table below for courses that count towards each of these categories. SPAN 291 & SPAN 391 may also satisfy these requirements when offered on appropriate topics. If a course is listed as both a Spanish Literature course and a course with a focus on Spain or Latin America, it will satisfy both requirements, but the student will only earn 3 credits for the course. In this case, the student must take an additional Spanish major course of his/her/their choosing to meet the 24-credit requirement.

\*\*\*\* Students must take additional Spanish major courses from the following list to complete the major requirement of 24 credits. (Keep in mind that upper-level Spanish major courses are offered on a rotating basis.)

**NOTES:**

- If a student begins his/her study of a language at the beginning or intermediate level (SPAN 111 – 113), he/she/they should consult with the Department Chair as early as possible to discuss any necessary adjustments to the suggested sequence, such as taking multiple Spanish classes in a single semester, taking Spanish and/or Core classes during the summer session, or studying abroad in a Spanish speaking country.
- To obtain certification candidates must pass the required Praxis exams. Certification in French and Spanish is valid for K-12.
- Students must achieve a rating of Intermediate Mid on the ACTFL Oral Proficiency Interview in order to student teach. They must achieve a rating of Intermediate High before applying for certification.
- All Secondary Teacher Certification candidates must complete six credits of college level mathematics and six credits of college level English:

The Pennsylvania Department of Education requires secondary teachers to have a degree in the content area for certification. Students seeking secondary certification must meet with his/her specific content area department for content area courses required for the degree. The Education Division is not responsible for content area or Core courses for secondary certification candidates.

<sup>^</sup> Depending on the level at which students start their Spanish courses, students who wish to student teach in their spring semester senior year are strongly encouraged to take summer courses or study abroad in a Spanish-speaking country to fulfill the major course requirements. Note that King's does not typically offer Spanish major courses over the summer, so students wishing to complete summer credits that will count towards the Spanish major will need to do so through an approved study abroad program. Alternately, students may take Core courses over the summer and take additional Spanish major courses during the Fall or Spring semesters. **Consult with your advisor as soon as possible.**

<sup>1</sup> Choose one course from each of the Core Requirements listed on the reverse side.

<sup>2</sup> Course may satisfy both a Major and a Core requirement. SPAN 114 and/or SPAN 115 will satisfy the Intercultural Competence Core requirement.

<sup>4,5</sup> Students should strongly consider taking MATH 101 and MATH 102 in place of MATH 120. The content of the MATH 101/MATH 102 sequence is consistent with the material found on the Basic Skills examination. Together, MATH 101 and MATH 102 satisfy the three math credits required for King's College Core Curriculum as well as the six credit math requirement for Education.
