Clinical Medicine in Lima, Peru



Under the leadership of King's College Physician Assistant (PA) faculty, Lisa Zimmerman, this one-week program abroad will provide graduate PA students with an opportunity to use their clinical skills to extend medical care services to patients in the Holy Cross community's Policlínico (multi-specialty clinic) and experience the Holy Cross's broader mission by living at the Holy Cross Peyton Center in the Canto Grande neighborhood of Lima. The group will also tour the cultural and natural richness of the area.

The Program

This medical service immersion program is affiliated with the Holy Cross community of priests, sisters, and lay people in the Canto Grande neighborhood of Lima, Peru. The Holy Cross have sponsored the Policlínico Parroquial Hermano medical clinic, schools, churches, and other services in this area for many years.

Through this one-credit course, PA graduate students will assist staff and visiting physicians with the diagnosis and management of common chronic health conditions seen in patient populations across the world, including anemia and diabetes. Students will also assist in the evaluation and management of patients who present to the clinic with acute conditions in this underserved population. This hands-on experience will allow students to not only apply knowledge for the management of acute and chronic medical conditions, but also appreciate how cultural and ethnic practices affect the practice of medicine.

The cost of the program is estimated to be \$4,000. The price includes all travel, accommodations, excursions, site visits, meals, medical emergency insurance, and one-credit King's College tuition. Some financial aid and scholarships are available.
