Under the leadership of Michael Little, Ph.D., (English) and Dr. Laine Little, Ph.D., (Arts), this short-term faculty-led study abroad program based in Seville offers students the chance to study and experience day-to-day life in southern Spain while practicing the art of travel writing. Students will identify broad topics of individual interest (such as food, art, history, religious and cultural practices, architecture, etc.) to investigate prior to travel, then experience first-hand the realities through guided tours, life with Spanish families in home-stay accommodations, and opportunities to explore Seville according to their own interests. This program is a unique experience blending cross-cultural study, experience, and written reflection to bring it all into focus.

The Program

It's a cliché—but true nevertheless—that traveling thoughtfully broadens your perspective like nothing else can. This is a course about using writing to travel thoughtfully, about learning to appreciate travel as something more than sight-seeing or thrill-seeking, as an experience that can be as instructive, political, personal, reflective, and profound as you want it to be.

From our base in Seville, we'll spend 16 days taking in the culture, history, art, and day-to-day-life of southern Spain. In pairs, students will room with homestay families, which will allow us to settle a bit, to live in Seville more than just visit. We'll still take amazing day trips to Cordoba and Italica, and an overnight trip to Granada, but the rest of our time will be spent getting to know Seville. We'll visit places like the Alcazar, La Giralda, the Museo de Bellas Artes, and the Plaza de Espana, but you'll also have time to explore neighborhoods, local markets, local restaurants—whatever suits your interests.

The estimated program cost of \$4,900 covers all travel, accommodations, lectures, site visits, meals, emergency insurance, and three-credit King's College tuition. Financial aid and scholarships are available.
