Our program offers two distinct degrees: Literature (with the option of Secondary Education certification) and Professional Writing. The Literature degree immerses students in the study of literature spanning centuries as well as miles. Professional Writing majors focus deeply on the profession of writing, taking classes in Editing and Document Design and getting hands-on experience through internships, all while studying fundamental theories of how and why writing works the way it does.
