- Choose one course from each CORE category as listed for Foreign Languages Majors
> CORE courses may be taken in any order approved by the academic advisor with the following conditions:
- CORE 100 and CORE 110 should be taken in the first year.
- CORE II5 (or II6) should be taken within the first two years.
- For students selecting a Foreign Language (CORE $14 \times$ ), every effort should be made to register for that language in the first semester at King's.
