General duties include a range of academic library services, including instruction, reference, designing digital learning objects, online instructional tools, collection development, and campus outreach, as well as participation in department, college-wide, and professional activities. One weeknight per week during the semester is required. Minimum salary: \$57,875.

- An ALA-accredited master's degree in library science.
- A demonstrated interest in teaching and commitment to student learning. Experience in library or classroom instruction.
- Knowledge of current trends in information literacy instruction and reference.
- A strong public service orientation, with effective interpersonal, verbal, written, and online communication skills.
- Ability to create student-focused instructional materials and to utilize appropriate digital resources to facilitate instructional goals.
- A strong desire to take initiative and be self-directed, while also collaborating with others.
- The ability to work creatively, effectively, independently, and cooperatively with all members of the college community.
- Evidence of potential to meet requirements for faculty advancement, including professional development, scholarship, and service.

**Preferred:**

- Experience in natural or health sciences (Physician Assistant, Athletic Training, Nursing, etc.) and/or business.
- Experience with classroom teaching utilizing active learning techniques and one-on-one instruction.
- Experience with technologies used in the creation of online tutorials and other instructional materials.
- Familiarity with learning management systems.
