Tuition and fees are subject to change yearly. The College general fee includes the following campus services: Remote Library, Student Services, the IT Help Desk, and transportation services. On-campus parking fees range between \$255-300 per year for those who choose to have a car on campus. Textbook estimated costs may change, based on current course requirements. OT fees include AOTA/POTA Membership, classroom

software, lab/collaboration/resource room supplies and materials, electronic records software, fieldwork placement software, personal protective equipment, HIPAA/OSHA/IRB/CPR, and other training. The above costs do not include room and board or travel costs for fieldwork education/doctoral capstone experience as these will vary greatly by student, location, site requirements, etc. The above students are also required to have a laptop computer with a video camera and microphone throughout the entire program and reliable access to the internet (cost not included).

ACCREDITATION INFORMATION:

King's College has been granted Candidacy Status by the [Accreditation Council for Occupational Therapy Education \(ACOTE\)](#) for an entry-level Doctor of Occupational Therapy (OTD) program. The program must have a pre-accreditation review, complete an on-site evaluation, and be granted Accreditation Status before its graduates are eligible to sit for the national certification examination for the occupational therapist administered by the National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy (NBCOT). After successful completion of this exam, the individual will be an Occupational Therapist, Registered (OTR). In addition, all states require licensure to practice; however, state licenses are usually based on the results of the NBCOT Certification Examination. Note that a felony conviction may affect a graduate's ability to sit for the NBCOT certification examination or attain state licensure. Students must complete 24 weeks of Level II fieldwork as well as an individual 14-week capstone experience within 24 months following the completion of the didactic portion of the program. The doctoral capstone experience must be started after completion of all coursework and Level II fieldwork as well as completion of preparatory activities defined in 2018 ACOTE OTD Standard D.1.3.
