



**Full-Time Faculty Appointment- Didactic Coordinator
for the entry-level Doctor of Occupational Therapy (OTD) Program**

King's College in Wilkes-Barre, PA is seeking a Full-Time Faculty Didactic Coordinator for the entry-level Doctor of Occupational Therapy (OTD) Program. The Program is an Applicant Program anticipating admitting its first cohort of doctoral students in 2024, with Candidacy submission in August 2023. This appointment is for a full-time, 12-month position, anticipated to start in July/August 2023. A stipend for Summer 2023, beginning in May, may also be available. Rank and position type commensurate with individual experience.

The successful candidate will work directly with the program director and have a passion for curriculum design, development, and pedagogy; and assist in leading the program to initial accreditation. The candidate is expected to contribute to an environment and culture within the King's OTD program that expects and supports excellence, diversity, collegiality, teamwork, innovation, best practice, and inclusive teaching approaches. The teaching load for this position is 30 credits per 12-month academic year inclusive of time assigned for administrative tasks. Faculty will be required to engage in service, scholarship, and professional development according to the standards proportionate to rank and position type and accreditation standards.

For consideration, at time of hire applicant must meet ACOTE requirements for the position which include:

- NBCOT certified occupational therapist who is licensed (or eligible) by the PA State Board of Occupational Therapy for a minimum of 3 years
- Earned doctoral degree awarded by an institution that is accredited by a regional accrediting body recognized by the U.S. Department of Education (USDE)

The ideal candidate will have strong evidence of excellence in teaching or capstone/fieldwork education (at least 3 years), the ability to demonstrate strong teaching and leadership/mentorship practices, evidence of understanding teaching and learning theory/practice, knowledge of ACOTE B standards, and the accreditation process. All faculty must be willing to comply with ACOTE Standards related to faculty (A.2.3, A.2.6, A.2.7, A.2.9, A.3.7). The position will include teaching responsibilities but also assisting the program director in oversight of curriculum implementation and quality control, course scheduling, junior faculty, and adjunct faculty mentoring, educating OT department/faculty on best teaching practices, and assisting with data collection and accreditation process.
