What Can I Do With a Degree in Theology?

It complements professional training in medical, business, or communications fields by demonstrating broad-mindedness and an ability to find unexpected solutions to persistent problems. Theology also enriches a focus in social work, education, psychology, ministry, or other service-oriented careers.
