



Dear Members of the King's College Community,

Earlier today, you received an email from Fr. Tom Looney, President of King's College, announcing a delay in the start of the Spring 2022 semester. Classes will now begin in-person on Monday, January 24. The purpose of this email is to provide further detail about how this change impacts our academic calendar. Courses scheduled for the Spring 2022 semester will now be held according to the following calendar:

The new features of this revised Spring semester calendar are:

- Classes begin one week later (Monday, January 24 instead of Tuesday, January 18).
- Classes will be held on Thursday, April 14, according to a Friday schedule.
- Classes will be held on Monday, May 9 and Tuesday, May 10 (with a Thursday schedule on Tuesday, May 10).
- No classes or exams on Wednesday, May 11 to allow for a reading day.
- Final exams are from Thursday, May 12 through Tuesday, May 17. Finals will be held on Saturday, May 14, but not on Sunday, May 15.

The dates and course offerings in the 1st accelerated spring session are unchanged and are not impacted. These changes only apply to the Spring 2022 term.

Students engaged in clinical experiences, field experiences, student teaching, and similar experiential learning may need to pursue their studies along slightly different timelines. Similarly, students in the 1-2-1 Nursing Partnership with Luzerne County Community College and students cross-registered for courses at Wilkes University or Misericordia University may also need to complete their studies on timelines dictated by partner institutions. The College will collaborate with students, faculty, and staff in these programs to successfully address and accommodate such circumstances.

Further details regarding pre-semester testing, safety protocols, and other matters will be provided by the appropriate College offices, such as Residence Life, Student Affairs, and Human Resources. These updates will be provided to you as soon as possible, and the College appreciates your patience and understanding as you await more information.

I hope that all of you have been able to find time for rest and renewal during the recent holiday season and that you and your families are staying safe and well. I look forward to the opportunity to be with you in-person on campus again in a few weeks.
