## Core Curriculum

## General Core Requirements

A student must earn a minimum of 120 credit hours to be awarded the baccalaureate degree. The number of credit hours required for graduation may be higher in certain major programs or if the student elects to pursue a second major. The requirements of the Core Curriculum represent 52 credit hours. Beyond the requirements of the Core Curriculum and of a student's chosen major program, the balances of the credit hours required for graduation are free electives. Keep in mind that some majors require specific core courses. It is important to refer to your Major Academic Planner and consult with your academic advisor when selecting your courses.
