<sup>1</sup>Students are required to take CORE 150, CORE 180 OR CORE 190 to fulfill the Interdisciplinary CORE requirement.

- If a student takes CORE 150, then he/she should choose from 181 188 to fulfill the 18x requirement AND from 191 198 to fulfill the 19x requirement.
- If a student takes CORE 180, then he/she should choose from 151 158 to fulfill the 15x requirement AND from 191 198 to fulfill the 19x requirement.
- If a student takes CORE 190, then he/she should choose from 151 158 to fulfill the 15x requirement AND from 181 188 to fulfill the 18x requirement.

<sup>2</sup>Students may select "free electives" for personal enrichment <u>OR</u> for Minor and/or Second Major Requirements.

<sup>3</sup>Students majoring in Philosophy are required to take CORE 280, 281, and 286 **OR**, as an alternative sequence, HNRS 280, HNRS 281, and CORE 281. These courses fulfill the Major requirements while satisfying the CORE Philosophy I and II requirements. Students majoring in Philosophy are also required to complete a capstone paper. Ordinarily, the capstone paper will be completed as a major paper in an upper level philosophy course during the student's senior year. Students may also choose to satisfy the capstone requirement by taking PHIL 490: Independent Senior Capstone Seminar in the spring of their senior year. See Philosophy Department Chair for details.

#### **General Information:**

A student must earn a minimum of 120 credit hours to be awarded the baccalaureate degree. The number of credit hours required for graduation may be higher in certain major programs <u>or</u> if the student elects to pursue a second major. Beyond the requirements of the Core Curriculum and of a student's chosen major program, the balances of the credit hours required for graduation are "free electives."
