- CORE 153 satisfy the CORE Social Science requirement
- CORE 180 satisfies the American Studies CORE requirement
- CORE 193/IB 241 satisfies the CORE Contemporary Global Studies requirement
- MATH 123 satisfies the CORE Math requirement
- MSB 287 satisfies the CORE Philosophy II requirement

<sup>2</sup>Students may select "free electives" for personal enrichment <u>OR</u> for Minor and/or Second Major Requirements. Up to six hours of internship credit may also serve as free electives.

<sup>3</sup> CORE 110, and CORE115/116 are prerequisites for many upper-level courses and should be taken during the first year.

**NOTE:** CORE 287 is **NOT** the equivalent of MSB 287.

#### **General Information:**

A student must earn a minimum of 120 credit hours to be awarded the baccalaureate degree. The number of credit hours required for graduation may be higher in certain major programs <u>or</u> if the student elects to pursue a second major. **Accounting (General Track)** requires 126 credits.

Beyond the requirements of the Core Curriculum and of a student's chosen major program, the balances of the credit hours required for graduation are "free electives."
