- If a student takes CORE 180, then he/she should choose from 151 - 158 to fulfill the $15 x$ requirement AND from $191-198$ to fulfill the 19x requirement.
- If a student takes CORE 190, then he/she should choose from 151 - 158 to fulfill the 15 x requirement AND from $181-188$ to fulfill the 18 x requirement.

The content of the MATH 101/MATH 102 sequence is consistent with the material found on the Basic Skills examination. Together, MATH 101 and MATH 102 satisfy the three math credits required for King's College Core Curriculum as well as the six credit math requirement for Education.
${ }^{5}$ EDUC 299 Basic Skills is a pre-requisite for all 300 and 400 level education courses. In order to register for this course, you must take and pass all basic skills tests.


## General Information:

A student must earn a minimum of 120 credit hours to be awarded the baccalaureate degree. The number of credit hours required for graduation may be higher in certain major programs or if the student elects to pursue a second major.
Beyond the requirements of the Core Curriculum and of a student's chosen major program, the balances of the credit hours required for graduation are "free electives." Because of the CORE, Major, and Secondary Education requirements, there are no "Free Electives" for students majoring in English/Secondary Education.
