${ }^{3}$ Students majoring in Political Science are required to take CORE 153. This course will satisfy both major and CORE Social Science requirements.
${ }^{4}$ All secondary teacher certification candidates must complete six credits of college level mathematics and six credits of college level English. CORE 110 and CORE 16__ satisfy the secondary certification requirement for English. For the six credit Math requirement, students should strongly consider taking MATH 101 and MATH 102 in place of CORE 120. The content of the MATH 101/MATH 102 sequence is consistent with the material found on the Basic Skills examination. Together, MATH 101 and MATH 102 satisfy the three math credits required for the King's College Core Curriculum as well as the six credit math requirement for Education.
${ }^{5}$ EDUC 299 Basic Skills is a pre-requisite for all 300 and 400 level education courses. In order to register for this course, you must take and pass all basic skills tests. Formal application to the Education Department between 48 and 60 credits - failure to complete EDUC 299 by 60 credits will result in the dropping of teacher certification in compliance with PDE regulations.


## General Information:

A student must earn a minimum of 120 credit hours to be awarded the baccalaureate degree. The number of credit hours required for graduation may be higher in certain major programs or if the student elects to pursue a second major.
Beyond the requirements of the Core Curriculum and of a student's chosen major program, the balances of the credit hours required for graduation are
"free electives." Because of the CORE, Major, and Secondary Education requirements, there are no "Free Electives" for students majoring in Political Science/Secondary Education.

- Consult your Academic Advisor prior to course registration.
- Refer to the King's College Catalog and/or website for course titles and descriptions.

- CORE courses may be taken in any order approved by the academic advisor with the following conditions:
- CORE 100 and CORE 110 should be taken in the first year.
- CORE 115 (or 116) and CORE 120 should be taken within the first two years.
- CORE 098, CORE 099, and/or CORE 110L, if required, will fulfill elective credits.
- For students selecting a Foreign Language (CORE 14x), every effort should be made to register for that language in the first semester at King's.
