
NURSING - 1-2-1 Dual Degrees in Nursing

Minimum Credits Required for Graduation = 128

¹Nursing students are highly recommended to take CORE 190 to fulfill the Interdisciplinary CORE requirement and the Global Studies Core requirement.

²Nursing students are highly recommended to take CORE 288 Bioethics to fulfill the Philosophy II requirement.

³Nursing students are required to take MATH 126 Introduction to Statistics to fulfill the CORE 120 Core requirement.

General Information:

A student must earn a minimum of 128 credit hours to be awarded the baccalaureate degree. The number of credit hours required for graduation may be higher in certain major programs <u>or</u> if the student elects to pursue a second major.

Beyond the requirements of the Core Curriculum and of a student's chosen major program, the balances of the credit hours required for graduation are "free electives."

 - CORE 100 and CORE 110 should be taken in the first year.
 - CORE 115 (or 116) should be taken within the first two years.
 - For students selecting a Foreign Language (CORE 14x), every effort should be made to register for that language in the first semester at King's.
