${ }^{3}$ Students may select "free electives" for personal enrichment OR for Minor and/or Second Major Requirements.
**Professional Writing majors must complete either ENGL 200 or ENGL 201. If a student takes ENGL 200 in the fall, then he or she need not take ENGL 201 in the Spring. IF a student takes ENGL 201 in the Spring, then he or she need not take ENGL 200 in the Fall.
***ENGL 329 is a 4 credit course; ENGL 331, 332, 335 are 3 credit courses.

## General Information:

A student must earn a minimum of 120 credit hours to be awarded the baccalaureate degree.
