- 1. If a student begins his/her study of a language at the beginning or intermediate level (SPAN 101 104), he/she may not graduate within four years. He/she should consult with the Department Chair as early as possible to discuss different options such as taking Spanish classes during the summer session or studying abroad in a Spanish speaking country.
