Upon graduation, a student will receive a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration (B.S.B.A.) with a major in Accounting.

*In order to be licensed as a Certified Public Accountant in certain jurisdictions students are encouraged to complete credits in forensic accounting which is an additional three credits in accounting electives beyond the requirements of the degree program. A Forensic Accounting Minor is available for accounting majors which is an additional 9 credits beyond the requirements of the degree program. Students are encouraged to obtain a minor selected from any of the minors offered by King's College. A student must earn a minimum of 120 credit hours to be awarded a baccalaureate degree. The number of credit hours required for graduation may be higher in certain major programs or if the student elects to pursue a second major or minor.
