<sup>3</sup>Updated Child Abuse & Criminal Record & FBI Clearances **REQUIRED** for EDUC 235, EDUC 240, EDUC 270, EDUC 305, EDUC 350, EDUC 366, EDUC 467, EDUC 468 and ENGL 399.

<sup>4</sup>EDUC 299 Basic Skills is a pre-requisite for all 300 and 400 level education courses and ENGL 399. In order to register for this course, you must take and pass all basic skills tests. Formal application to the Education Department between 48 and 60 credits – failure to complete EDUC 299 by 60 credits will result in the dropping of teacher certification in compliance with PDE regulations.

<sup>5</sup>Students should strongly consider taking MATH 101 and MATH 102 in place of MATH 120. The content of the MATH 101/MATH 102 sequence is consistent with the material found on the Basic Skills examination. Together, MATH 101 and MATH 102 satisfy the three math credits required for King's College Core Curriculum as well as the six credit math requirement for Education.
