\*Students majoring in Philosophy are required to take PHIL 101, 170, and 173 **OR**, as an alternative sequence, HNRS 280, HNRS 281, and PHIL 170. These courses fulfill the Major requirements while satisfying the Core Introduction to Philosophy and Philosophical Investigations Core requirements. Students majoring in Philosophy are also required to complete a capstone paper. Ordinarily, the capstone paper will be completed as a major paper in an upper level philosophy course during the student's senior year. Students may also choose to satisfy the capstone requirement by taking PHIL 490: Independent Senior Capstone Seminar in the spring of their senior year. See Philosophy Department Chair for details.

\*Students majoring in Philosophy are required to complete nine additional philosophy credits from the list below. In rare cases, PHIL 170-199 courses may substitute for these philosophy credits with the consent of the Philosophy Department Chair.
