## NOTES:

After obtaining Registered Nurse (RN) licensure, state-approved, nationally accredited associate or diploma nursing program graduates may apply for the Bachelor of Science (BS) in Nursing degree program. A cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher is required for admission. The RN to BS in Nursing Degree requires 120 cr. for graduation. Coursework includes NSG 410: Community Health Clinical, a 2-cr. course in which students will gain community health experiences, and NSG 500: Advanced Physical Assessment, a 3-cr. course, which may be applied to a Master of Science Degree Program in Nursing.
