# EDUCATION FIVE-YEAR B.A./M.ED. IN READING PROGRAM

Do you remember that one special teacher who made a difference in your education? As a teacher, you have the power to impact young people's lives and the King's College five-year program offers you the additional expertise to help students master an important life skill, reading efficiently and effectively.

### **Individualized Attention**

At King's College, we recognize that we need to model good teaching so that you will become the best educator you can be.

"Faculty at King's are studentcentered, a trait that is passed on to our own majors," explains Dr. Denise Reboli, chairperson of the Education Department. Our programs meet the rigors of the Pennsylvania Department of Education. Each student is assigned an education advisor, and, together, they create a plan for future success.

#### **Five Year Program**

King's College Education Department is approved by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to offer a variety of certification programs, including Grades PK-4, Special Education PK-12, and Reading Specialist PK-12. Upon completion of the five year program, successful candidates will be eligible for certification in all three areas. Students will earn a bachelor's degree with a double major in Education Grades PK-4 and Special Education PK-12 and a master's of education degree in reading.

Students would apply for admission into the 5th year program concurrently with their application to the Education Department at the conclusion of their sophomore year. Students



who will be accepted must have met all requirements for entry into the department:

- Basic Skills
- 3.0 GPA
- Followed planner sequence
- Completed both Admission to Teacher Education application form (required by PDE) and the King's College Graduate Application.

Should students meet all requirements, they will be accepted conditionally to the graduate program and asked to maintain a 3.0 GPA in the two graduate courses in the undergraduate degree.

- Upon successful completion of student teaching and obtaining a 3.0 in the two graduate courses taken, they will be formally admitted into the graduate program in Reading where they will need to maintain a 3.0 GPA.
- The majority of the graduate level courses will be completed during the fifth year of study.

Certification as a Reading Specialist will further enhance your knowledge of teaching reading. It will equip students with a specialized body of knowledge and set of skills to assist struggling readers in the regular education classroom.

## **Real World Ready**

Our teacher candidates begin preparation to teach very early in their years at King's. Each of our field experiences is embedded within a class so that teacher candidates have the opportunity to practice what they are learning in the classroom. All students will complete their undergraduate program by student teaching in a local school, usually during their last semester at King's. In addition to field experience to enhance the PK-4/Special Education program, students will also have field experiences during the fifth year specifically geared to working with struggling readers, the very type of reader found in both traditional and special education classrooms.

#### **Placement Highlights**
