### **A Vibrant Learning Community**

Working closely with dedicated professors, King's Honors students from all majors exchange ideas, debate, and practice independent thinking through an individualized program of instruction. Because of the advanced level of the coursework, Honors students take fewer required courses, enabling them to more easily pursue a minor or second major.

King's Honors students benefit from:

- Small Classes. Honors classes are limited to 15 students, allowing for more personal interaction with professors and classmates.
- Engaged Learning. Honors classes are taught in an interactive classroom format emphasizing discussion and thorough exploration of subject matter.

Our program extends learning beyond the classroom through a variety of teaching methods, such as study abroad and service learning, and internships. Other opportunities to learn outside the classroom include:

- The Grimes Lecture series:
   The Honors Student Advisory Council invites a major scholar to speak on campus each year to challenge our Honors students' thinking.
- Our monthly "Lounge and Learn" event, in which a faculty member visits the Honors Lounge to discuss his or her current area of research in a relaxed atmosphere.
- Weekend trips to cities such as New York City, Boston and Washington, D.C.
