



King's College Degree Requirement

The requirement for the degree of Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science is the completion of a minimum of one hundred and twenty (120) semester hours of credit. Some majors require more than 120 semester credit hours for the student to be eligible to receive the degree. A student is expected to earn at least sixty semester hours of credit, including the senior year, and 50% of the major sequence at King's College. It is the student's responsibility to select the courses that will satisfy the graduation requirements of the College.

In addition to satisfying the quantitative graduation requirement in credit hours, the student must maintain a minimum grade point average of 2.00, cumulative and in the major. Some departments may require a grade point average that exceeds 2.00. Students must complete all course requirements in order to participate in graduation ceremonies.

King's College will award only one bachelor's degree per graduate. The completion of additional majors will be entered on the student's transcript without designation of an additional degree.

In their final semester undergraduate students must register for GRAD*400 and graduate students must register for GRAD*500. At the start of their final semester, students registered into these courses will be contacted by the Registrar's Office to submit a Graduation Application. Information on the Graduation Application indicates how the name of each graduate should be printed on his/her diploma and whether or not the graduate will attend the commencement ceremony.

Any late Graduation Application submissions or any changes made to a student's Graduation Application after April 1st or December 1st for May and December graduates, respectively, will result in a \$50 late charge. The college cannot guarantee that it will be able to provide a diploma by graduation for any late Graduation Application submissions or changes.
