

King's College Nursing Scholarship Application

2018-2019 Academic Year

Nursing scholarship application is due by **July 16, 2018**.

This application is awarding 30 credits towards the BS in Nursing. The completion of the 30 credits (25 nursing and 5 core) must be completed within 3 years or you lose the remaining remuneration for credits. Additional credits required for completion of the degree, based on transcript evaluation, will be the responsibility of the student. Employee tuition remuneration cannot be used if scholarship covers course work unless additional core are being taken with two nursing courses each semester. It can be requested once the scholarship money is exhausted. Students must be enrolled in a minimum of one nursing course each semester. Students must meet the following criteria for admission into the RN to BS in Nursing program:

- 1. Competency in English by passing the TOEFL exam with a 90% or better if English is not the native language. The passing score on the TOEFL will vary depending on the type of exam you take (internet based, computer based, or paper and pencil). TOEFL scores must be submitted with application deadline. If you have a bachelor's degree from a U.S. college or university, you do not need to take the TOEFL.
- 2. Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75
- 3. Official transcripts from previously attended accredited schools, colleges or universities
- 4. Evidence of RN licensure or eligibility to take the RN licensure exam
- 5. Health examination and Clinical Education requirements during Community Health
- 6. Proof of immunizations

In addition to meeting the admission requirements for RN students, articulation status and the awarding of advanced placement credits for licensure (35) is determined by the following:

- a. Graduates from accredited associate's degree or diploma nursing programs within three years of the application date are eligible for direct articulation and will be awarded 35 advanced placement credits for their prior nursing course work.
- b. Graduates from accredited associate's degree or diploma nursing programs within four to ten years of the application date must provide official written documentation of completion of a minimum of 1,000 hours or more clinical practice during the three years prior to the application date to be eligible for direct articulation and the awarding of 35 advanced placement credits for their prior nursing course work.
- c. Applicants who have graduated more than ten years prior to the application date must provide a resume detailing clinical experience, along with official written documentation of completion of a minimum of 1,000 hours or more clinical practice during the three years prior to the application date. These candidates may be required to complete a full portfolio or validation

testing prior to being eligible for articulation and the awarding of 35 advanced placement credits prior to nursing course work.
