- Resident students will be notified regarding the dates for move-in, which will begin during the week of August 17th.
- Fall Break has been eliminated and we will have classes on Labor Day.
- In-person classes end on Wednesday, November 25th, the day prior to Thanksgiving.
- Final exams are take-home or online. The exams will be taken or due between Monday, November 30 and Saturday, December 5.
