



King's College Social Justice Scholarship for Study Abroad

Information Sheet - 2021

The King's College Social Justice Grant for Study Abroad provides supplemental grants for students who show a commitment to service to others and to social justice. The amount of the award varies. The grant is part of the King's College's commitment to making experiential learning affordable and accessible to a wide group of students and, as well, connecting study abroad to the King's College mission to serve the common good.

Eligibility:

- Demonstrate in your essay how the features of your study abroad program will serve the growth of your commitment to social justice, in your personal identity and career activities.
- Preference will be given to students who show financial need and have not had prior opportunities to travel or study abroad. Preference will be given to study in the following geographical areas: Africa, Asia, Central and Eastern Europe, and Latin America.
- Students are encouraged to apply for funds for programs of a variety of types and lengths (including King's faculty-led study abroad programs).
- Scholarship may be used for virtual study e-broad or traditional study abroad with an approved provider.

Application Deadlines:

Thursday, April 1, 2021 (for study in Summer or Fall 2021)

The application should be submitted entirely online using the electronic form on the Office of Study Abroad Website Scholarship Page.

Students will be notified of awards soon after applying; scholarships will be applied to your account only upon evidence of acceptance to an approved program and a financial commitment (deposit).

Requirements:

Grant recipients will reflect on their experiences and share them with the King's community by submitting a small, captioned photo essay. Specific instructions and support will be given to this end.
