

John Lepore ('60) Scholarship for Study Abroad Information Sheet – For Travel in 2022

Joseph Lepore '60 dedicated his life as a teacher to introducing young people to foreign languages and cultures. After graduating from King's College with a degree in French, Mr. Lepore went on to earn his master's degree in French language and literature from the University of Notre Dame and to teach for many years at high schools in our region, including sponsoring study abroad to France! Through the creation of the Joseph D. Lepore '60 Study Abroad Scholarship, established by his wife, Teresa, his daughter, Maria, and his son, John, Mr. Lepore's legacy will help King's students to explore the world through study abroad programs. The scholarship is given to King's students who demonstrate financial need to enable them to participate in a study abroad program, with preference given to students who desire a French language study abroad experience.

Eligibility:

- Demonstrate financial need
- Preference will be given to students who plan to study French language outside the United States who have not had prior opportunities to travel.
- In 2022, scholarship may be used for virtual study e-broad or traditional study abroad with an approved provider.

Application Deadline and Instructions:

The deadline for application is Friday, December 3rd (for study in summer 2022 or fall 2022). The application should be submitted entirely online using the electronic form on the Office of Study Abroad Website Scholarship Page.

Additional Requirements:

After returning from study abroad, scholarship recipients will reflect on their experiences and share them with the King's community by submitting a brief, captioned photo journal. Specific instructions and support will be given to this end.
