# **SOCIAL WORK**

Social workers connect vulnerable and disadvantaged people with essential welfare systems, assistance programs, and resources. Their help reaches individuals, families, and community groups struggling with disabilities, mental health concerns, addiction, violence, or trauma. Social workers also help marginalized youth, veterans, the elderly, incarcerated individuals, and unhoused, immigrant, or refugee communities.

With a social work degree, you'll advance human rights and social, economic, and environmental justice. You'll identify diverse community groups and how their identities impact social experiences. You'll also assess and engage with individuals, families, groups, organizations, and communities while developing policy and conducting research.

Our faculty are experienced leaders in their respective fields, bringing the knowledge, values, and ethical standards necessary to teach you how to serve future clients and communities. In-person learning is enhanced through service learning and a liberal arts foundation. You will integrate theory and skill at human services and social change organizations with innovative field, practicum, and internship courses offered through our Shoval Center for Community Engagement and Learning and our Office of Career Planning.

#### Minor in Psychology or Sociology

Housed within the Sociology and Criminal Justice Department, this program also benefits from academic



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partnerships with the College's psychology, education, law, political science, economics, and health sciences departments. Students earning a Bachelor of Arts in Social Work can also earn a minor in psychology through an additional 12 credits and/ or a minor in sociology through an additional 6 credits.

#### **Career Opportunities**

Social workers practice in a broad variety of settings, including schools, hospitals, public agencies, the justice system, and private practice. According

to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, the median salary for social work careers is currently above \$55,000, and overall employment is projected to grow 7% over the next ten years.
