MAKING THE TRANSFER HAPPEN

Requirements

To be considered a transfer, you should have completed at least one college credit after graduating from high school. As you consider transferring, it's important to know what steps are necessary.

- Complete the online application for FREE at **kings.edu/apply** for the fall or spring semester.
- **Submit** your official high school or college transcripts. Acceptance is conditional upon completion of current coursework in good academic standing.
- King's will perform a transfer credit evaluation. Credit is accepted in transfer for those courses in which the student has received the equivalent of a "C" grade or better and which are applicable to the degree chosen.

Financial Aid

We go above and beyond to make our highquality education affordable and accessible to anyone who wants to attend King's College. We start by encouraging every student to apply for financial aid using the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), regardless of their circumstances. In doing so, you'll find out if you qualify for funds to help you pay for college, including scholarships, grants, and other aid directly from King's College as well as grants and loans from the federal government or the state government.
